REFLECTION from Fr. But just as the landowner rewarded those laborers who did not work a full day, even if we have been complacent or inactive in the way we have lived out our faith, God gives us hope and calls us to action. Just as the landowner paid all the same wage, God's same love and mercy are extended to all who accept his gift of salvation. We
