This weekend, we celebrate Catechetical Sunday. Pope Francis recently issued a letter stating the importance of reading of novels and literature for seminarians and for priests, indeed for all Catholics. While it is appropriate to briefly greet other parishioners in a very quiet voice before Mass, it is not appropriate to have a lengthy conversation. This quiet reflection time is a part of our reverence and love for the Eucharist and for the Mass.
