Ingredients for Thanksgiving meal preparation boxes for the 4Cs will be collected in the church's vestibule on the weekends of November 2-3 and 9-10. Our goal is to have 20 of each item listed:

- Preschool – Evaporated Milk and Condensed Milk
- K-2nd – Cornmeal and Flour packages (small is fine)
- 3rd-4th – Chicken Broth cartons
- 5th-6th – Cream of Chicken and Cream of Celery canned soups
- 7th-8th – Boxed macaroni and cheese
- Confirmation – Stuffing boxes or bags
- Post-Confirmation – Green Beans (canned)
- Knights – Fresh Celery, Onions, Bell Peppers (please bring Nov. 16-17)
- Ladies' Auxiliary – Pie shells and canned filling
- Young at Heart – Sweet potatoes (canned)
- Adult RE – Milk in cartons (that does not need to be refrigerated)
- RCIA – Rolls (please bring Nov. 16-17)
- Cash Donations are also welcome. There will be a deposit box in the vestibule. These will be used to purchase turkeys.
