The third Sunday in Ordinary Time was designated as the Sunday of the Word of God by Pope Francis back in 2019. Sunday of the Word of God is to be devoted to the celebration, study, and dissemination of God's holy word. Recalling the importance given by the Second Vatican Council to rediscovering Sacred Scripture for the life of the Church, Pope Francis explains that this celebration has ecumenical value with other Christian denominations, since the Scriptures point out, for those who listen, the path to authentic and firm unity. For me, the process of writing homilies and delving into the word of God in that way has helped me keep Sacred Scripture at the center of my life as a priest. I encourage all of you to find ways to delve into God's word as an integral part of your life of discipleship. Father Lincoln.
