Symbolon: The Faith of the Church

On August 17, a new adult religious education program is being offered on Sundays at 9 am in McGing Hall. From the Augustine Institute (as seen on the FORMED Platform), this study invites parishioners on a journey through salvation history and the core teachings of the Catholic faith using the Nicene Creed as a guide. This 16-episode series explores everything from the sacraments to inspiring saintly stories, empowering each of us to understand, love, and share our faith confidently. Classes will meet for one hour and will typically consist of a 30-minute video session, followed by lively group discussion. Symbolon has been used all over the world in OCIA, catechist training, men's and women's groups, Bible studies, and more.

Friday, August 15 is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary and is a Holy Day of obligation. Mass at Holy Savior is at 8:30 a.m. and 6 p.m. Mass at Immaculate Conception is at noon.




